## Job and assignments

The EHS manager ensures risk prevention in close co-operation with the company head. He/she advises and supports the various units to assess risk and define safety, hygiene and environment policies. His/her role is essential to identify, assess and control occupational risks. He/she initiates actions for prevention and control as well as HSE training courses for the workforce.

## Work environment

He/she works within the EHS or Quality department of a company. He/she is present on the various production sites onboard a vessel and/or in a workshop.
